Bob was a swell guy, a good fighter pilot who loved to fly. I served with him later at Elgin AFB Florida in 1955 – 1958 and got to know him better. We had many enjoyable times on cook-outs and out water skiing.

We were also together in the Pentagon in 1959 – 1960 or 61 and it was there that he had surgery for cancer in the intestinal area and sometime in 1960-61 I had been on leave and on my return discovered that Bob had died.

I hope you all have a good reunion and I know that when you tip your glasses to Bob – somewhere he will know and I'm sure he would be with you if he were here today.
