THE OTHER SHOT DOWN (BY OUR OWN FORGES), BUT BOTH CREW AND PILOT, RESPECTIVELY RESCUED.

3. TARGETS SUCCESSFULLY BOMBARDE; UGANDA THROWING 183 ROUNDS OF HIGH EXPLOSIVE (A TON FROM EACH GUN) IN HER SEVEN MINUTE ASSAULT ON SUKAMA. THIS WAS THE FIRST BOMBARDMENT OF JAPANESE SOIL BY A CANADIAN WARSHIP IN THIS OR ANY OTHER WAR. THE TRIGGER WAS PRESSED BY MR. THE BIG NEWS ON THE WESTERN FRONT IS THAT THE GERMAN NAVAL COMMANDER IN CHIEF, ADMIRAL VON FREYDERBURG SAPPROXIMATELY) BIGNED TERMS OF UNCONDITIONAL SURRENDER TO GEN. MONTGOMERY AT 8 A.M. BRITISH TIME TODAY. THIS INVOLVED DENMARK, THE ISLANDS OFF NORTHWEST GERMANY AND ALL THE VESSELS IN THE AREA. THE SURRENDER ALSO PRESUMABLY APPLIES TO GERMAN SHIPS AT SEA,
INCLUDING THE U-BOATS, BUT THERE HAS BEEN NO CONFIRMATION THAT THEY HAVE CAPITULATED. IF THEY DO, THEY WILL COME UP AT VARIOUS POUNTS IN THE NORTH ATLANT!
AND SIGNAL THEIR POSITION.

THE GERMANS TRIED TO MAKE A DEAL WITH MONTY ON THURSDAY. HE SENT THEM AWAY AND TOLD THEM TO COME BACK WHEN THEY WERE WILLING TO TALK UNCONDITIONAL

SURRENDER. THEY CAME BACK FRIDAY AND SIGNED IN TEN MUNUTES.

THERE ARE NOW NO GERMAN AR.Y UNITS FIGHTING IN THE NORTH-WEST OR WESTERN FRONTS, OR IN ITALY. MORE THAN 2,000,000 NAZIS HAVE BEEN KNOCKED OUT OF THE WAR IN THE PAST FEW DAYS, TOTAL SURRENDER IS EXPECTED DAILY IF NOT HOU-RLY. DOUBTLESS THEIR PROBLEM IS TO FIND AND ORGANIZATION TO MAKE THE SURRENDER JAP RADIO CLAIMS THAT THE U-BOATS WILL FIGHT ON. WHERE THEY WILL BE SUPPLIED FROM REMAINS A MYSTERY.

THIS IS THE CAPTAIN SPEAKING.

FROM WHAT I HEAR, IT SEEMS TO ME THAT THERE ARE STILL SOME DOUBTS AS TO THE MEANING OF WHAT I PROPOSE TO ASK OF HEADQUARTERS, SO I SHALL MAKE A LAST ATTEMPT TO EXPLAIN.

- 1. I AM ASKING WHETHER YOU WILL, OR WILL NOT, CONTINUE TO SERVE IN THIS SHIP AND FIGHT AGAINST THE JAPANESE IN THIS OR ANY OTHER THEATRE OF WAR UNTIL THE SHIP UNDERGOES HER FIRST ANNUAL REFITM O, IF SHE IS BADLY SMASHED UP, HER FIRST EXTENSIVE REFIT, SHOULD THIS HAPPEN BEFORE THE ANNUAL REFIT IS DUE.
- 2. IF YOU AGREE TO STAY ON YOU HAVE TO DO NOTHING IN THE WAY OF SIGNING. BUT, IF WOU DO NOTHING, MEN YOU CANNOT SHANGE YOUR MIND BETWEEN NOW AND THE REFIT. AND YOU ARE EXPECTED NOT TO THINK, OR WRITE TO ANYONE, THAT YOU ARE KEPT HERE UNDER COMPULSION. IF YOU WANT TO GO, YOU MAY. THERE MUST BE NO DOUBT OF THAT.
- 3. IF YOU DO NOT AGREE TO STAY YOU ARE ASKED TO SIGN A FORM IN MY SECRETARY'S OFFICE BETWEEN Ø8ØØ AND 16ØØ TOMORROW MONDAY. THE FORM READS:
  "I HEREBY CERTIFY THAT I DO NOT VOLUNTEER FOR SERVICE IN THE WAR

AGAINST JAPAN NOR DO I VOLUNTEER FOR SERVICE IN THE PACIFIC THEATRE OF WAR".

4, I SHALL MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO GET AS MANY AS POSSIBLE OF THOSE WHO DO NOT VOLUNTEER ON THEUR WAY HOME BY THE FIRST AVAILABLE MEANS AFTER GERMANY! COLLAPSE. FROM THE LOOK OF THINGS NOW THIS WILL PROBABLY MEAN THE NEXT TIME WE COME TO THE OILING AREA - IN ABOUT FOUR DAYS TIME. IF VERY LARGE NUMBERS WANT TO LEAVE, I SHALL TRY TO BORROW FROM THE R.N. OR AUSTRALIAN NAVY TO KEEP THE SHIP GOING UNTIL CANADIAN RELIEFS CAN ARRIVE AND THIS MAY DELAY THE DEPARTURE OF THOSE WHO WANT TO GO.

5. IF WE CAN GET OVER THIS HURDLE AND THUS ENSURE THE SHIP'S KEEPING MORE OR LESS EFFICIENT, I SHALL THEN ASK THOSE WHO DO WISH TO VOLUNTEER FOR SERVICE IN THE NAVY, ASHORE OR AFLOAT, UNTIL THE END OF THE JAP WAR, TO SIGN THE PRESCRIBED FORM AS SIGNALLED A FEW DAYS AGO FROM OTTAWA. SUBTRACTING THESE NAMES (IF ANY) FROM WHAT WE HAVE LEFT WILL SHOW THOSE WHO IN REALITY, ARE NOT DESIROUS OF CONTINUING. HEADQUARTERS WILL BE ASKED TO RELIEVE THEM AS SOON AS P OSSIBLE BUT NOT IN VERY LARGE NUMBERS AR ANY ONE TIME, SO THAT THE SHIP'S EFFICIENCY MXY BE KEPT UP. IN OTHER WORDS, IF YOU WISH TO GET OUT BUT DO NOTH-ING ON MONDAY, YOU ARE NOT COMMITTING YOURSELF BEYOND OUR FIRST LONG REFIT, AND YOU MAY GET AWAY SOONER.

6. TODAY I HAD QUITE A LONG LETTER FROM OTTAWA ON THE SUBJECT OF "PACIFIC LEAVE" WHICH CONCLUDES WITH THE WORDS " .. YOU MAY REST ASSURED THAT IF ANY SPECIAL LEAVE IS GIVEN IN ADDITION TO NORMAL LEAVE TO PERSONNEL PROS-EEDING TO THE FAR EAST, THOSE OFFICERS AND MEN NOW SERVING IN HMCS UGANDA WILL BE ENTITLED TO SUCH LEAVE WHEN THEY ARE RETURNED TO CANADA1. THIS LETTER WAS WRITTEN MARCH 26TH. AND A BIGNAL OF APRIL 18TH. ESTABLISHES THAT SPECIAL LEAVE IS BEING GIVEN.

7. I WISH TO FINISH BY READING A SIGNAL FROM THE VICE ADMIRAL OF THE BRITISH PACIFIC FLEET TO THE ROYAL NAWY OFFICERS AND RATINGS OF THE FLEET, WHICH I THINK IS WORTHY OF STUDY, "WITH THE END OF THE WAR IN THE NORTHCOMING VERY CLOSE, I KNOW THAT ALL OF US MUST BE WESHING THAT OUR WIVES, OUR FAMILIES AND OUR FRIENDS COULD FEEL THAT WE, TOO, WERE OUT OF THE WAR. I SUGGEST THAT THE BEST THING WE CAN DO TO HELP THEM IN OUR LETTERS HOME IS TO SAY THAT TOGETHER WITH MANY THOUSANDS FROM ALL OVER THE EMPIRE, WE WITH OUR ALLIES ARE GOING ON TO FINISH THEJOB OFF PROPERLY, SO THAT PEACE, WHEN IT COMES, SHALL BE WORLD WIDE AND SO HAVE A BETTER CHANCE OF LASTING. THE BEST NEWS OF ALL WE CAN GIVE THEM IS TO TELL THEM THAT WEEARE IN GOOD HEARY.

IT IS SAFE TO SAY THAT THESE DEMONSTRATIONS ARE BEING REPEATED IN OUR OWN CITIES: VANCOUVER, WINNIPEG, TORONTO, MONTREAL AND HALIFAX.

THE WAR WITH GERMANY IS OVER. IT LASTED FIVE YEARS, EIGHT MONTHS AND FOUR DAYS, AND WAS THE GREATEST CATASTROPHE THE HUMAN RACE HAS EVER KNOWN.

IT COST THE LIVES OR 20 MILLIONS OF PEOPLE, A LARGE MAJORITY OF THEM IN THE

PREDICTED FOUR YEARS AGO THAT "THIS WOULD BE OUR FINEST HOUR", WILL SPEAK TO THE WORLD AT 10 P.M. TONIGHT, AND AN ATTEMPT WILL BE MADE TO BRING THIS SPEECH TO THE SHIP OVER THE S.R.E. HIS MAJESTY THE KING WILL SPEAK AT 4 AM.

THE ACTUAL DETAILS OF THE STGNING OF THE ARMISTICE WERE SIMPLE.

THEY WERE SIGNED AT RHEIMS, IN FRANCE, BY THE GERMAN CHIEF OF STAFF ON ORDERS FROM GRAND ADMIRAL DOENITZ. GEN. EISENHOWER WAS NOT PRESENT, BUT LATER RECEI-VED GERMAN OFFICERS. THE GERMAN PEOPLE WERE TOLD THAT THEY WERE THROUGH, AND THAT THEY WERE TO EXPECT STERN TERMS FROM THE ALLIES. IN SPITE OF THIS, ONE

SMALL POCKET ON CZECHOSLAVAKIA FOUGHT ON, FACING ANNIHILATION.

AND SO THE "MASTER RACE" HAS BEEN BROUGHT TO ITS KNEES. HITLER AND GOEBBELS HAVE SUICIDED; HESS IS OUT OF HIS MIND; GOERING WAS LAST REPORTED SUFFERING FROM "A SEVERE HEADACHE". AND WHAT HAS BROUGHT THIS ABOUT? INSPIRED ALLIED LEADERSHIP - HOW DEARLY WE WISH THE LATE PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT COULD HAVE BEEN SPARED ANOTHER MONTH, TO SEE HIS LABORS CROWNED WITH SUCCESS. - AND BY THE "BLOOD, TOIL, SWEAT AND TEARS" OF MILLIONS OF LITTLE PEOPLE.

IN THE WINNING OF THIS VICTORY, THE ROYAL CANADIAN NAVY CAN TAKE A MODICUM OF PRIDE. HER BASIC JOB WAS CONVOY ESCORT - TO DELIVER THE TOOLS W

WITH WHICH TO FINISH THE JOB - AND M STARTING FROM SCRATCH, SHE BID IT BLOODY WELL. BE HER EFFORTS, AND THOSE OF HER HALLANT BROTHERS-IN-ARMS, SHE HAS EMERGED FROM THIS WAR WITH THE SAME PRESTIGE SHE WON IN THE LAST GREAT WORLD

7. EASILY THE MOST SPECTACULAR RAID OF THE DAY WAS THE ONE ON FORM-IDABLE, AND IN DEALING WITH IT, THE ROYAL NAVY GAVE US SOME LESSONS IN SHILL AND DETERMINATION UNDER FIRE. SUFFERED DAMAGE.

NAVY SECRETARY FORRESTAL TOLD THE U.S. HOUSE THAT THE JAPS WILL PROBABLY BEGIN AN ALL-OUT SUBMARINE ASSAULT ON AMERICAN SUPPLY LINES IN THE PACIFIC. HE SAID THAT THE MAIN JAP NAVY HAD BEEN REDUCED TO " A MEDIUM-SIZED TASK FORCE" BUT THAT THEY STILL HAD AN EFFECTIVE SUBMARINE FLEET. LATE SATURDAY NIGHT AVENGER BOMBERS OF ADMIRAL SPRUANCE'S TASK FORCE HIT FOUR PLACES ON KWUSHU ISLAND, SHOOTING DOWN 12 JAP PLANES. THEN, ON SUNDAY AND MONDAY, ALL TYPES OF CARRIER PLANES MADE HEAVY ATTACKS AGAINST AIRFIELDS THROUGHOUT KYUSHU AND SHIKOKU. IN TWO DAYS, AMERICAN PLANES DESTROYED 164 JAP PLANES IN THE AIR AND ON THE GROUND, AND DESTROYED OR DAMAGED 108 OTHERS ON THE GROUND. ANOTHER 73 PLANES WERE ATTACKED WITHOUT ANY VISIBLE RESULTS. THE ATTACKS PRECEDED THE BIG FIRE-BOMB RAID ON NAGOYA. EARLY REPORTS SHOW 10 AMERICAN PLANES LOST FROM THESE ATTACKS. ON MONDAY, PLANES FROM "BABY FLAT TOPS" HIT AIRFIELDS IN THE SAKA-SHIMA GROUP (WHICH WE ARE GURRENTLY ATTACKING) AND POSITIONS ON KUMIT ISLAND.

CHINESE SAY THAT THE JAP IS PUTTING UP A TOUGH FIGHT IN THE STREETS

AMERICAN CASUALTIES ON ÓKINAWA TO MAY 18 ARE: ARMY TROOPS 3093 KILLED AND MISSING; 12,078 WOUNDED. FLEET MARINE FORCES: 1239 KILLED AND MISS-ING, 6180 WOUNDED. U.S. PACIFIC FLEET: 4000 KILLED AND MISSING 3958 WOUNDED.

THERE HAS BEEN ANOTHER BIG AIR-RAID ON TOKYO. B-29'S ALSO HIT NAMAMATSU, JAPANESE PRE-WAR TEXTILE CENTER. THE RAID WAS MADE WITH DEMOLITION BOMBS YESTERDAY. MANY OTHER SMALL TOWNS IN NOVA SCOTIST REPORTED SIMILAR RIOTS, WITH THE LOCAL LIQUOR STORES MAIN TARGET. IN DARTMOUTH RAPE WAS REPORTED. THE NAVAL OFFICER FOUND BEATEN TO DEATH ON DALHOUSIE CAMPUS WAS IDENTIFIED AS LT. CMDR. JOHN SMITH, RCNR, FORMER C.O. OF ST. FRANCIS.
THE REST OF CANADA WAS APPALLED AT THE HALIFAX SHOW. TORONTO HAD A

BIG PARADE AND A LOT OF NOISE, BUT LITTLE DAMAGE. WINNIPEG WAS QUIET. IN VAN-COUVER, LIQUOR STORES AND BEER PARLORS WERE CLOSED.

SEVERAL SERVICE MEN IN HALIFAX SAID THAT THEY WERE "SO SSHAMED OF THEIR UNIFORMS THEY WANTED TO GET OUT OF THEM, SO THAT THEY WOULDN'T BE MARKED. AND THE MOST SIGNIFICANT OBSERVATION CAME FROM A SOLDIER VETERAN OF SICILY, ITALY AND NORMANDY, WHO BROKE INTO TEARS AND SAID: "IS THIS WHAT WE'VE BEEN FIGHTING FOR"?
