



I've thanked my God I have met such a woman!



#### MEMORANDUM:

Ottawa, Canada. 6th January, 1943.

- The daily rate of pay for a Probationary Wren is 90 cents. After the basic training, pay will be increased to 95 cents a day, and then Wrens are entitled to additional proficiency pay in the selected category, in accordance with W.R.C.N.S. regulations.
- 3. You will probably be required to stay in the Training Depot for one month. Upon completion of your training you must be prepared to proceed direct from the Depot to the Establishment to which you will be drafted.
- 4. Uniform will be issued as soon as possible. No underclothing is provided, as a grant of \$15.00 is given in lieu. You should, therefore, bring with you serviceable underclothing and enough civilian clothing to last you for one week. The following list is for your guidance:

l suit and dress or 2 dresses
l pr. indoor shoes
l pr. bedroom slippers
l dressing gown
pr. bloomers, closed at the knee
l pr. low-heeled walking shoes
