

having been duly sworn states:-


1, Sgt Pitts Acting Medical Sgt 37 Hald Rifles
at Niagara Camp on July 8. I received a call
and proceeded to a tent in the proximity of the
parade grounds, where I found Rflm Green and
Rflm Anderson who had apparently suffered from
heat. I applied cold towels to their foreheads
and loosened their clothing. Rflm Green
responded to treatment very quickly. I told
Anderson to go to his tent and rest for the rest
of the day. In the meantime Sgt. Gritt of the
R.A.M.C. came over and I told him about Rflm.
Anderson. He took his temperature and it was
high and told me to take him over to the
hospital which I did.



3rd Witness:-

Sgt. F.R.Hines Acting C.S.M. of A. Coy, Hald Rifles
having been duly sworn states:-

I was the Acting C.S.M. of A. Coy, Hald Rifles,
at Niagara Camp during annual training. Rflm.
C.F.Anderson was a member of my Company and was
on parade on the morning of July, 7. During
this parade Rflm. Green collapsed and I assisted
in taking him to a nearby tent, and sent for Sgt.
Pitts. After I reported back, Rflm. Anderson
collapsed and I assisted in taking him to the tent
where Sgt. Pitts was attending Rflm. Green. I
left him in the care of Sgt. Pitts and returned to
the parade grounds.



The Court having carried out the investigation in accordance with K.R. Canada, ~~Reports~~ 647-648 reports:-

That Rflm Anderson's illness or injury occurred while he was on parade at Niagara Camp.

In accordance with K.R.Can. 647, it is my opinion that;

1. Rifleman Anderson C.F. was on duty when the injury occurred.
2. The injury was caused by virtue of the execution of his duty.
3. He was in no way to blame for the injury.


Dear Mr. Anderson:

It is with regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 2nd of March from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services informing you that your son, Cecil Floyd Anderson, Leading Signaller, Official Number V-8276, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, has been wounded in action.

As you are already aware, your son was reported to be among the survivors of H.M.C.S. "LOUISBURG". Word has just been received that he was admitted to the 95th General Hospital, Algiers, on the 7th February, suffering from perforated intestines, and placed on the "Seriously Ill" list on the 8th February. He was removed from the "Seriously Ill" list on the 13th February, which would indicate that he is progressing satisfactorily.

As soon as he is fit to travel he will be returned to the United Kingdom for subsequent passage and leave in Canada.

Dear Mr. Anderson:

I deeply regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 24th of May, 1943, from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, informing you that your son, Cecil Floyd Anderson, Leading Signaller, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, Official Number V-8276, has passed away.

As you have been previously informed, your son was placed on the seriously ill list at the 95th General Hospital in Algiers on the 19th of March, 1943, suffering from mastoiditis. On the 4th of May, after a mastoidectomy had been performed, his condition was still considered serious. A report has now been received from Algiers that Leading Signaller Anderson passed away in the hospital on Tuesday, the 18th of May, 1943, the final cause of death being meningitis.

May I again express sincere sympathy with you in your bereavement on behalf of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, the Chief of the Naval Staff and the Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy.
