
It is with deepest regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 27th August from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services informing you that your brother, Lloyd George Campbell, Able Seaman, R.C.N.V.R., has been reported missing on active service.

Complete details are not available, but it is known that your brother was serving in the Combined Operations at Dieppe on August 19th, 1942, and has been missing since that time.

It is not possible at this time to say definitely whether your brother was taken prisoner or whether he lost his life during these operations. You may be assured, however, that immediately any further information is received you will be informed.

I wish to express the sincere sympathy of the Chief of the Naval Staff, Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy, the high traditions of which your brother has maintained.



A full report on his illness has been forwarded to
the British Red Cross Society. The funeral took
place on 24. 10. 42 with full military honours. A
detachment of German infantry fired volley marks
grave and incense were kind on behalf of the hospital
staff, his comrades & the German Wehrmacht. The
coffin was draped with the Union Jack and the last
rest sounded by a British NCO.

Dear Madam,

I regret to inform you that V.17138 Leading Seaman CAMP-
BELL, Lloyd.G., P.o.W. No. 42959, Royal Canadian Navy, died in
this hospital on 21.10.1942.

I forward herewith a report on his illness and death and
trust that you will forward as much as you think desirable to
his mother whose address is:-

992, Oxford Street,
London, Ontario,
Canada.

Leading Seaman Campbell was admitted to this hospital
on 27.8.42. suffering from extensive gunshot wounds of the right
leg. An attempt was made to save the limb but a few days later
amputation became necessary and was carried out by Major F.R.R.
MARTIN, R.A.M.C. below the knee. A blood transfusion was given
at the same time, the donor being S.Q.M.S. CAREY, RASC. A few
days later severe secondary haemorrhage necessitated ligation of
the Femoral Artery. After this operation his condition
remained satisfactory for some time but then deteriorated owing
to the spread of sepsis, to the knee joint with the development
of a suppurative arthritis. A second blood transfusion was
given, the donor being Major C. WHITCOMBE, RA., and re-amputation
above the knee was performed by Major W.E. TUCKER, RAMC.
Subsequently after a period of marked improvement, a condition
of acute dilatation of the stomach set in. Treatment, which
included a continuous intravenous drip saline, was unavailing
and he succumbed to exhaustion on 21.10.42.

I at once informed the Swiss Embassy and have to-day
completed the necessary papers for the International Red Cross.

Campbell was buried at Meiningen Cemetery, Thüringia,
with full military honours. A detachment of German Infantry

fired volleys over the grave and the Last Post was sounded by a British N.C.O. The service was conducted by the Rev. D.G. SMITH, CF. and six British Officers and eighteen other ranks provided a guard of honour and laid floral tributes at the graveside. The coffin was, as is usual, draped with the Union Jack.

We were all most grieved by Campbell's death. The development of this final rare complication at a time when he was beginning to do so well and after all that he had been through can only be described as a tragedy. His relatives might care to know that after his last operation he suffered the minimum of pain and his last hours were very peaceful.

Dear Sir & Madam:

From information received in this Office it is noted that you have received a communication from the marginally named party who was a prisoner of war at Camp Stalag 9C Germany, prisoner of war number 42959.

I deeply regret to inform you that information received through the International Red Cross Committee at Geneva, Switzerland, advises that the marginally named died on the 21st of October, 1942, as the result of blood poisoning from an amputation.

As this Office is unable to identify the marginally named as a member of the Canadian Army it would be greatly appreciated if you would advise the undersigned for official purposes what force the marginally named was connected with when taken prisoner of war.
