- (5) On being enrolled as a member of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, I undertake and bind myself:—
- (a) To serve from the date thereof for the duration of hostilities, being subject to the provisions of the Naval Service Act, and of the Regulations made in pursuance thereof for the government of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, and to the customs and usages of His Majesty's Canadian Naval Service.
- (b) To report for active service when called and to serve ashore or afloat as may be directed, according to where my services are required.
- (c) To keep in good repair and condition the articles of uniform and any articles of outfit which may be issued to me and to return them to the nearest naval establishment prior to my discharge or when required so to do by any authorized person, or to pay compensation for any loss or damage thereto other than fair wear and tear; and also, until called into active service, not to wear such uniform or outfit (which is and remains the property of the Crown) except when on naval duty.
- (d) To undergo vaccination or re-vaccination, or inoculation, as considered necessary by the appropriate authorities.
- (e) I have not been induced to enter as Stoker Ic (T) by the prospect of being transferred at some future date to any other branch or rating.

Dear Mr. Bell:

It is with deepest regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 1st of May, 1944, from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, informing you that your son, Donald Alexander Bell, Stoker First Class, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, Official Number V.53224, is missing from H.M.C.S. "Athabaskan".

According to the report received from overseas, your son's loss occurred when H.M.C.S. "Athabaskan" was torpedoed and sunk by enemy action on the 29th of April, 1944, in the English Channel. Further particulars of this Naval disaster are being published in the newspapers.

While Stoker Bell is reported as "missing", there is a possibility of his survival. It is understood that a number of the crew have been taken prisoners of war by the enemy. The Red Cross have been informed and are attempting to obtain from the German Government a list of those taken. Please be assured that as soon as any further information respecting your son has been received you will be informed.

Please allow me to express the sincere sympathy of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, the Chief of the Naval Staff and the Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy, the high traditions of which your son has helped to maintain.

It is with deepest regret that I must inform you that in view of the length of time which has elapsed since your son, Donald Alexander Bell, Stoker First Class, Official Number V-53224, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, was reported missing from H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN", and as no news has since been received to the contrary, the Canadian Naval Authorities have now presumed his death to have occurred on the 29th of April, 1944.

May I again express sincere sympathy with you in your bereavement on behalf of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, the Chief of the Naval Staff, and the Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy.

Dear Mrs. Bell:

With reference to your letter of recent date it has been learned in the Department that along the coast of Finistere, France at Brignogan, Plouescat, Santec and L'Aberwrach, shortly after the tragic sinking of H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN", bodies from this ship were recovered and buried. Of approximately seventy bodies known to have been recovered in this region, only two, however, were identified. In many cases all positive means of identification were taken from the bodies by the Germans and retained by them.

While the wallet you received may have been obtained by the Germans in the above manner, there is insufficient evidence to determine exactly how it came into their possession or to establish that your son's body was recovered. It is quite feasible that during the emergency that existed at the time that articles of clothing and personal effects were discarded, lost or appropriated by members of the crew.

Regarding the unidentified bodies, it is understood that the citizens of the French towns where they were recovered, looked after the burials and held funeral services, even against the wishes of the Germans.

It is regretted that this Department is unable to offer you any hope that your son is alive. The extensive investigations conducted by the Allied authorities on the Continent since the cessation of hostilities have failed to bring to light any news of his fate. Nor has any information been received from the Canadian Naval authorities overseas that mention of Stoker Bell was made in the captured German casualty records.

An extensive search for graves of Canadian Naval personnel who lost their lives in the European theatre of war is still being conducted by the Director of Graves Registration and Enquiries, London, England and the Imperial War Graves Commission and you may rest assured that should a grave be located or any other news received, you will be informed immediately.

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Bell:

On the cessation of hostilities the Army Graves Services, Overseas, made searches on the Continent in an effort to locate graves and identify bodies. Exhumation reports, dental records, etc., of casualties from H.M.C.S. "ATHABASKAN" have since been turned over to the Secretary of the Imperial War Graves Commission, Wooburn House, Wooburn Green, High Wycombe, Bucks., England, who, in turn has forwarded them to Naval Headquarters with a view to definitely establishing the identity of bodies which were exhumed and over whose graves temporary markers in some cases have been placed.

As the dental particulars on the exhumation reports respecting your son, the late Stoker First Class Donald Alexander Bell, Official Number V-53224, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, are similar to those on file at Naval Headquarters, such particulars have been accepted as positive identification.

Stoker Bell's grave is located in the Plouescat Communal Cemetery, Plouescat, Finistere, France, in Plot Number 1, Row 'A', Grave Number 2. It is understood a permanent headstone will be erected in due course by the Imperial War Graves Commission (Overseas). It is suggested that any inquiries regarding your son's grave should be addressed direct to the Secretary of that Commission.
