On being enrolled as a member of the Quebec Division of the Royal Lanadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, I undertake to bind myself:— To serve from the date thereof for the duration of hostilities, being subject to the provisions of the Naval Service Act, and of the Regulations made in pursuance thereof for the government of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, and to the customs and usages of His Majesty's Canadian Naval (b) To report for active service if called upon in time of war or emergency, and, if called into active service, to serve ashore or afloat as may be directed, according to where my services are required. To keep in good repair and condition the articles of uniform and any articles of outfit which may be issued to me and to return them to the nearest Divisional Commanding Officer or to Training Headquarters prior to my discharge or when required so to do by any authorized person, or to pay compensation for any loss or damage thereto other than fair wear and tear; and also not to wear such uniform or outfit (which is and remains the property of the Crown) except when on naval duty. (d) To undergo vaccination or re-vaccination, or inoculation, as considered necessary by the appropriate authorities. Dated this 11th day of Signature of applicant. 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Dear Mrs. Flageol:

It is with deepest regret that I must confirm the telegram of the 1st May, 1944, from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, informing you that your brother, Paul Henri Aloys Chemberland, Able Seeman, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, Official Number V-3677, is missing from H.M.C.S. "Athabaskan".

According to the report received from overseas, your brother's loss occurred when H.M.C.S. "Athebaskan" was torpedeed and sunk by enemy action on the 29th of April, 1944, in the English Channel. Further particulars of this Naval disaster are being published in the newspapers.

While Able Seemen Chamberland is reported as "missing", there is a possibility of his survival. It is understood that a number of the crew have been taken prisoners of war by the enemy. The Red Cross have been informed and are attempting to obtain from the German Government a list of those taken. Please be assured that as soon as any further information respecting your brother has been received you will be informed.

Please allow me to express the sincere sympathy of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, the Chief of the Naval Staff and the Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy, the high traditions of which your brother has helped to maintain.
