

THE SHIP'S NAME

The name "Cowichan" is that of a proud tribe of Indians who lived on the lower east coast of Vancouver Island. The area they inhabited now bears their name as have two previous ships of the Royal Canadian Navy.

The first "Cowichan" was a bangor class sweeper commissioned on 4 July, 1941. She served in the North Atlantic and in the English Channel. As a member of the only Canadian minesweeping flotilla to take part in sweeping the approaches to Normandy for D-Day, she did yeoman work. She was decommissioned at the end of the war.

During the postwar construction programme a Bay Class sweeper was given the name "Cowichan". Under the Mutual Aid Agreement of the North Atlantic Treaty she was turned over to France and renamed La Malouine.

Today we are commissioning a new "Cowichan". Launched at Yarrows Ltd. on 26 February, 1957, she bears a noble name well proven in the work for which she has been built.
