

This is to certify that according to information received at the Department of National Defence from the proper overseas authorities No. 40461, Shipwright, 3rd Class, Hugh Brown, Royal Canadian Naval Service was killed in action when H.M.C.S. FRASER was sunk in waters off the Coast of France on approximately the 26th June, 1940.
