The first WINNIPEG was a Algerine Class Coastal Escort built under the naval construction program of 1942-43. Her keel was laid down Jan 31, 1942 in Port Arthur Shipbuilding Company yards and launched Sept 19, 1942. Following commissioning, Jul 29, 1943, WINNIPEG sailed for Halifax, NS and then worked up in Pictou. She served in the North Atlantic with the Western Escort Force providing safe transit for merchantmen transporting supplies to Europe until the disbandment of the force, Jun of 1945; the end of the war.

WINNIPEG was briefly placed in reserve at Sydney, NS before sailing for Esquimalt, BC, Oct of 1945. Arriving Dec 21, 1945, she was decommissioned and paid off into reserve. In 1956 she returned to the east coast to be handed over to the Belgian Navy several years later, Aug 7, 1959 under the new name, "A.L. DUFOUR." She stayed in service until 1966 at which time she was scrapped.

Though her time was brief, the first WINNIPEG left a record of valuable action which was carried out in a difficult time; one in which the value of Canada's smaller escorts was estimable.

She passes on to her successor the battle honours:

"Atlantic 1942-43"

The second warship to carry the name of WINNIPEG was built under the CPF project 1983, which was expanded in 1987 for a total of 12 new Canadian designed and built ships. WINNIPEGs keel was laid Mar 20, 1993 in St John Shipbuilding Company yards, NB. After assembly of her 9 mega modules, she was floated up (launched) where the remainder of the ship's systems were fitted. WINNIPEG was christened in a traditional ceremony in St John, NB, Jun 25, 1994 by Her Worship, Mayor Susan Thompson.

WINNIPEG first sailed Sept 5, 1994 for sea trials and, after transiting to Halifax, was accepted from the contractor by the Navy Oct 11, 1994. She was manned by a west coast crew Oct 12, 1994 and continued with trials to validate contract standards. She left Halifax, NS Jan 17, 1995 and transited to Esquimalt, BC via the Panama Canal making her official arrival to the west coast, Feb 17, 1995; home at last.
