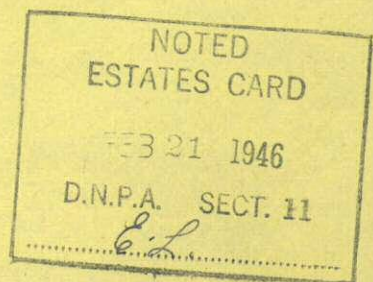



Hope this finds you both well & fine as usual. Had an inoculation & had a sore arm but its pretty fair ^{been} has nothing of any interest or much importance so far on the voyage. We'll be putting into a port tomorrow so I expect to get the letter off to you. The weather has been very good & the water calm. Its the smoothest trip I've made yet. More like a pleasure cruise, but it isn't always a pleasure.

I'm going to have trouble remitting money to you by money-order out here, so I'm having it send direct to the bank through the navy. It won't start till the end of February, so I would like you to check up about the end of March & see if its going through O.K. It amounts to about \$130.00 + a month so if I'm out here very long I should save a little. As long as I'm not able to get ashore too often I'll be O.K. ~~there~~. Have you seen anything in the papers about Canadians getting extra pay for Far Eastern duty? I've got wind of it but I can't get the details.

What's doing around home now? Seen any hockey or been skating at all? We clear the deck flight deck & play hockey or simulated thus about every other day after flying duties finish, & it usually ends up in a slaughter or we lose too many pucks over the side. Good exercise though & we sure need it. The less I do the less I want to do.

don't know, cause I think the enemy know more about what I'm doing than I do. so will say so long for now with all my love.

the telegram of the 16th of August, 1945, from the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, informing you that your son, Lieutenant (P) Gerald Arthur Anderson, Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, was killed in action on the 9th of August, 1945.

The only additional information which has been received at this time is that your son's death occurred at 8:36 o'clock in the morning of the 9th of August when his aircraft crashed into the sea on landing during recent operations. You may rest assured that any further news will be passed on to you as soon as it becomes available.

Please allow me to express sincere sympathy with you in your bereavement on behalf of the Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, the Chief of the Naval Staff, and the Officers and men of the Royal Canadian Navy, the high traditions of which your son has helped to maintain.


