

(5) On being enrolled as a member of the Montreal Division of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, I undertake to bind myself:—

(a) To serve from the date thereof for the duration of hostilities, being subject to the provisions of the Naval Service Act, and of the Regulations made in pursuance thereof for the government of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, and to the customs and usages of His Majesty's Canadian Naval Service.

(b) To report for active service if called upon in time of war or emergency, and, if called into active service, to serve ashore or afloat as may be directed, according to where my services are required.

(c) To keep in good repair and condition the articles of uniform and any articles of outfit which may be issued to me and to return them to the nearest Divisional Commanding Officer or to Training Headquarters prior to my discharge or when required so to do by any authorized person, or to pay compensation for any loss or damage thereto other than fair wear and tear; and also not to wear such uniform or outfit (which is and remains the property of the Crown) except when on naval duty.

(d) To undergo vaccination or re-vaccination, or inoculation, as considered necessary by the appropriate authorities.

Dear Mrs. Glasgow:

A Memorial has been erected at Port-Aux-Basques, Newfoundland, to the memory of those who died in the torpedoing of S.S. "CARIBOU" on the 14th of October, 1942. As your son was a passenger on this ill-fated ship it is felt that the following particulars regarding the unveiling and dedication of this Memorial may be of interest to you.

The Memorial consists of a twenty-five foot cenotaph erected on a large base designed to depict a miniature cemetery. The shaft is topped by a permanently burning amber light on top of which is a bronze caribou. On each of the four sides of the shaft there is a bronze plaque with the names of the casualties inscribed thereon.

The funds for this monument were raised by public subscription and sponsored by the Newfoundland Railway owners of the ill-fated Caribou.

The Memorial was unveiled by the Honourable H. W. Quinton, Commissioner for Public Health and Welfare, representing the Governor of Newfoundland. Officials of many national and local organizations were present, including a representative of the Canadian Government. The United States Army sent a detachment from Harmon Field to fire a three volley salute and the Officer-in-Charge laid a wreath on behalf of the United States Government.

Although the weather was somewhat inclement the simple but impressive ceremony was well attended and particularly so by the residents of Port-Aux-Basques and Channel most of them having had relatives on the vessel at the time of the disaster.

Enclosed is a copy of the program of the unveiling and dedication.
